DIONNE WARWICK
June 25 • 7:00 p.m.



This incredible talent, over an illustrious four-decade career, established herself as an international musical icon. Her reputation as a hit maker has been firmly etched into public consciousness, thanks to nearly sixty charted hits, beginning with “Don’t Make Me Over,” and followed by such treasured classic songs as “Anyone Who Had A Heart,” “Walk On By,” “A House Is Not A Home,” “Alfie,” “(Theme From) The Valley Of The Dolls,” “I’ll Never Love This Way Again,” “Déjà Vu,” and “The April Fools.” Her legend-making association with Burt Bacharach and Hal David produced such huge hits as “Do You Know The Way To San Jose,” “Message To Michael,” “This Girl’s In Love With You,” “I’ll Never Fall In Love Again,” and “Reach Out For Me.”

In 1985, Dionne joined again with Bacharach, and longtime friends Gladys Knight, Stevie Wonder, and Elton John to record the classic “That’s What Friends Are For,” with the profits from the sale of that song donated to the American Foundation for AIDS Research.

“Living Legend” is a term often overused in the entertainment world, but it is certainly an accurate moniker for one of popular music’s most talented performers, ever – **DIONNE WARWICK**

In New Business at the April meeting, the Board of Directors:

Approved dates for the 2011 LMVA election schedule as follows: Tuesday, October 4th for the District Delegate Elections, Tuesday, October 11th for the Reconvene District Delegate Meetings and Tuesday, October 25th for the Board Election Night. Motion: Sid Wittenberg; second: Diane Lincoln. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved an Easement for the City of Mission Viejo to expand and improve the Olympic Bicycle Finish Line Monument on the lakeside of Olympiad Road. Motion: Diane Lincoln; second: Dale Tarkington. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved a Letter of Authorization signed by the President of the LMVA Board for T-Mobile to take the next step

toward gaining approval to place a cell tower on LMVA property. Motion: Dale Tarkington; second: Sid Wittenberg. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved the 2011 Snack Bar Contract with Tony's Sea Landing. Motion: Alan Virdinis; second: Diane Lincoln. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved funding for the 2011 Fireworks Show including permits at a cost of \$11,500. Motion: Dale Tarkington; second: Diane Lincoln. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved funding for completion of the infrastructure needed for the communications upgrade in both East Beach and North Beach facilities at a cost of \$19,707.70. Motion: Alan Virdinis; second: Diane Lincoln. Vote carried 5-0-0.

Approved a new masthead for the newsletter, changing the name to Lake Mission Viejo with some additional artwork changes to come in the near future. Motion: Diane Lincoln; second: Alan Virdinis. Vote carried 5-0-0.

The LMVA Board of Directors meets on the second Tuesday of each month in the LMV administration building at 7:00 pm. All lake members are welcome to attend.

Leukemia Cup

Lake Mission Viejo Yacht Club is proud to host our 4th Annual Leukemia Cup Regatta, Poker Run, and Barbecue, as part of the nationwide fundraising event to support the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's research, education, and patient assistance programs. Several other yacht clubs in Orange County are also hosting events for this very worthy cause. Leukemia Cup co-chairs Kathleen Mellon, Staff Commodore Ron Meyer, a five-year leukemia survivor, and your local Yacht Club are proud to do

their part – but they need your help. So to provide more fun ways for you to participate, this year we've added a 5k Awareness Walk, a loop around the Lake, starting at 7:00 am. Then at 12:30, all you sailors can race in the Leukemia Cup Regatta for a small fee of \$15 for a single-handed boat or \$20 for a two-person boat. Quagga Mussel Prevention Program Continues to Keep LMV Waters Clean

In a concerted effort to maintain the pristine waters of LMV for all members to enjoy, LMVA staff has completed its third year of a Quagga Mussel Prevention Program. Over 9,000 boats have been tagged and allowed to enter LMV waters. All boats were subject to a 30-day quarantine to make sure they were clean, dry, and free of any quagga mussel.

Current program standards followed at LMV include inspections and quarantines of all boats that enter LMV. Boats entering the property are required to exhibit an LMVA quarantine tag, proving that they have not launched elsewhere for at least 30 days. Additionally, they are required to pass an inspection at launch proving that the vessel is clean and dry.

Boats exiting LMV are issued a green tag which allows that vessel to immediately return to LMV without the 30-day quarantine, but is still subject to inspection. Tags are fixed to the boat and trailer in such a way that the boat cannot be launched without breaking the tag. Broken tags require the 30-day quarantine and boat owners with tampered tags who attempt to avoid the quarantine system will be subject to disciplinary actions.

If you use any watercrafts or toys that have been to any other body of water, remember that they need to be completely clean and dry for 30 days before being placed into LMV waters. Also, please remember that all watercrafts need to be insured and registered with a current LMVA registration sticker affixed to the vessel. Cooperation of all LMVA registered boat owners is essential.

Dock to receive your blank poker "hand" and a dock map. There is a \$10 donation for the first hand and \$5 for each additional hand. Then visit the indicated docks by electric or party boat, where hosts and volunteers will welcome you with cards to add to your "hand." Prizes will be given for the high and low hands. How can you lose?

Prefer to stay on land? You can participate from 2:00-6:00 pm by bidding at the Silent Auction on a wonderful collection of gift items donated by generous local Orange County businesses. Business owners, it's not too late to contribute gift items of your products or services. What a way to spread the word about your business and your big heart!

Finally all participants are invited to partake in the delicious barbecue in the main picnic area from 5:00 pm to sunset, and to meet this year's Honorary Skipper Kellie Canaday, who was diagnosed with Acute Promyelocytic Leukemia in 2005, is now in her 5th year of remission, and is studying to become an Oncology RN in order to help others. One amazing young woman!

Concert Rules to Play By

1. No glass containers for drinks or food. All coolers, baskets, and bags are checked upon entry to the concert/park area.
2. CONCERT guest policies apply: limit of 4 guests; \$10 per person guest fee. All LMVA members **MUST** have ID card.
3. Bring short and low-back beach chairs only...please.
4. Get your spot early. These events are very popular.
5. Remain seated once the concert begins.
6. No tents or canopies after 6:00 pm.
7. Be courteous to those around you. No smoking in the bowl area.
8. No personal barbecues. Use barbecues in designated areas only.
9. Please pick up after yourself. Trash cans are available.
10. Use minimum space on lawn, there are many people to seat. Use small blankets and towels. No ground tarps allowed.
11. The area in front of the stage is not opened until stage set-up is completed.
12. When parking lots fill, cars will be allowed to drop off passengers only. Overflow parking is available on public streets.
13. No pets are allowed.

Thank you for your consideration of others. Your cooperation with the LMVA concert rules makes concerts enjoyable and safe for everyone!

Concerts are held Saturday evenings at 7:00 pm. *Jazzfest* and *Taste of the Lake* begin at 4:00 pm.

Your Ticket to LMV

The long summer days are a perfect time to visit your great LMV facilities. It doesn't matter if it is your first visit in a long time or if you are a familiar face at the front gates, your LMVA membership picture ID badge is required to gain entrance. This special card allows you access into the facilities and at the boat rental station; it also serves as your free ticket to this season's great concerts. Concert lottery attendees must present a valid membership card in order to take part in the lottery.

LMVA's picture ID badge is issued to all members eight years and over. It indicates the property and the individual through a barcode system. If you arrive at the gate without your badge, you will be turned away. A member who has lost or misplaced his/her badge but has other identification proving residency (i.e. Driver's License) can purchase a temporary pass for \$10 at the gate. This pass is good for seven days and can be exchanged for a new badge (if your old one is lost) at the Membership Office. If you know the whereabouts of your original badge and bring it back to the Membership Office within seven days, you can obtain a refund of the price of the temporary pass.

Most members have been very cooperative this year as we have encouraged staff to be diligent in checking membership identification at the gates. Make sure you always have your membership badge readily available when approaching the friendly staff at the LMVA gates or within the park facilities. The Board of Directors and Management would like to thank members for their efforts to help make LMV a safe and secure environment.

Guest Policy on Concert Days

1. During summer concert days at North Beach, LMVA members may bring up to four guests per household; this includes children. Guests must enter with the member.
2. Fees are \$10 per guest, including children on concert days at North Beach only. **CASH ONLY!**
3. East Beach guest fees continue to be \$2 on concert days.

Concert Seating: The Summer Saturday Morning Tradition Continues

LMV members will have something new to look forward to this season with the addition of a floating dock which will be the platform for the concert stage. Improved sight lines and seating areas will enhance the LMV concert experience for members and their guests. Concert lottery procedures will remain the same as in years past. Following are the details on how to participate in the lottery to obtain a good seat for each show.

The entrance gate to the North Beach facility will open as usual at 6:00 am. Access to the Concert Bowl area will commence at approximately 6:30 am. Members accessing the facility by car will be allowed to park in the Fisherman's parking lot and assemble in the Administration lot along with the pedestrian traffic prior to 6:30 am. Members arriving by boat will be allowed to tie up to the dock in front of the Maintenance building. Access to the Concert Bowl area will be conducted by a lottery style system; therefore **there is no advantage to lining up prior to 6:00 am.**

The Lottery process is as follows:

1. Randomly number wrist bands will be distributed upon the opening of the facility. Members only! You must show your ID card to get a wristband.
2. Wristband pick-up will be at designated locations in the main parking lot.
3. One wristband per person. It must be attached and worn.
4. Distribution will continue until designated time.
5. One blanket per person allowed in the park. No chairs allowed until after process is complete.
6. At a designated time, randomly selected groups of numbers will be called. Once called, members will proceed to a holding area. Wristbands will be verified and then the group will be allowed to set up in the park.
7. This process continues until all groups have been called.
8. At the conclusion of the set-up process, the park will open to general use and chairs may be brought in at this time. Chairs abandoned along the sidewalks adjacent to the Playa del Norte facility entrance will be confiscated. Please bring **ONE BLANKET ONLY** for the initial entrance into the bowl. Chairs will be allowed after the initial entrance process is complete.
